They don't need to be new but usable.

Finally the Housing Team continues to accompany families and will be adding two new families in April and May. We continue to need mentors to accompany them. Spanish speaking is not necessary.

## Food For Thought The Hymn of Christ

"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests, but each of you to the interests of the others.

In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.

And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death, even death on the cross." (Philippians 2:3-8)

This piece by Paul, known as the "Hymn of Christ," is likely the premier New Testament commentary on humility.

Written while in a Roman prison,
Paul cites the temptation of people to be like his opponents, who function in the dark of their selfish ambitions.

Such vainglory is countered by counting others more significant than ourselves.

In the body of Christ, we are called to put aside vain and self-serving behavior, and put others first. This works, because they're supposed to put us first, too. Paul explains how Jesus is our model for treating one another. Jesus, as God, humbled himself to the point of being crucified. Clearly, we can be humble to each other, choosing to put others first, even when it hurts.

On this past Holy Thursday, a profound yet simple act of deep humility was performed by our Pope Francis, in the shadow of his patron saint, Francis of Assisi. At the evening mass of the Lord's Supper, in a tent set up on the grounds of Rome's Rebibbia prison, Francis washed the feet of twelve inmates of the all-women facility. He poured water over their feet, towel-dried them, and kissed them. And the 12 women inmates wept.

The Pope spoke briefly: "By washing his disciples' feet, Jesus humbles himself.

He had said 'I came to serve, not to be served.'

Jesus forgives everything...he asks only that we ask pardon...all of us have failures—
everyone has their own story. The Lord awaits always with open arms..."

After mass, the Pope gave a large chocolate Easter egg to a little boy, the only toddler living with his mother at the prison, as permitted in Italy until they are 3 years old.


