

Fr. Carl's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

In May, the Archdiocese of Chicago will ordain only four men to the priesthood. This year, 22 parishes are asking for associates with only 10 on the list available to be transferred. There are several large parishes in need of Pastors. The Personnel Board is working hard to meet all the needs; trying to place priests in the parishes that need them the most. Having the right personality, and some experience in both leadership and administration all come into play on where and how the priests are assigned. It is not just about placing a priest at a site but having the right person to be pastoral as well as to lead and manage the many areas of parish life. For this reason, the Archdiocese has encouraged larger parishes like our two Oak Park united parishes, St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy and St. Giles and Ascension and St. Edmund, to have Operation Directors to help with the administrative piece so that the priests and other pastoral ministers can focus on the sacramental and pastoral care of the parish.

Along with this, we have been given the opportunity to develop not only our Parish Councils and Finance Committees but create a Leadership Team that can work together to build and support strong lay leadership in our individual parishes and the larger Oak Park Catholic Faith Community in areas where we are working together. One example is the *Spirit and Light Collaborative* and its Board that we have been developing these last two years. Having one Pastor is not the ideal or what our parishes have been accustomed to. However, this is a reality we are facing as we look to the future. The Archdiocese has supported us in our efforts to create a new structure that can work for this community as we move forward and to be considered as a model for other areas of our church that are facing similar situations. This is a wonderful opportunity as well as a challenge for us all. I have heard the excitement of some and the concern and fear of others.

I share all this during this Easter season as a reminder of what it means for us to act as disciples of Jesus. We can only imagine how the disciples and friends of Jesus must have felt as they struggled with His resurrection, trying to understand it and what it would mean for them as they walked into the future with their new reality. Each time we come together for Eucharist, our Lord is present to us, and we are asked to renew our commitment to follow Jesus. Let's not forget, disciples act with love. "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:35)

True disciples of Jesus know that how we treat others proves that we know Him and follow Him. Disciples answer the call. God chooses us first, but we must answer the call. If Peter had not dropped his nets and followed Jesus, he would not have been one of his disciples. Discipleship involves a choice to drop everything for Him. This might mean dropping a negative attitude about the changes we are facing, stopping the gossip about what we are unhappy about, and choosing to step up and take a new leadership role or to help support in some way all the new initiatives we are offering.

And one of the most important goals for us all is remembering disciples help make other disciples. Ultimately, we need to do what Jesus did, which is to make more disciples. This was His final command, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations." (Matthew 28:19)

At the core of our parish life is the goal – for our staffs, councils, leadership teams, formation programs, and for all of us – to follow the command of Jesus. All we do should have this mission as our goal, to make disciples who make disciples.

Today's scriptures remind us, that with his care and tending, God makes us his vineyard. When we attend Mass and participate as members of our faith community, we grow together as a fellowship of disciples nourished by Jesus' word. Jesus remains with us here at the table and in community. Together, we will remain in Jesus as his disciples who then go out and make more disciples. This is Easter, the vineyard grows and becomes more beautiful!

Have a safe and blessed week ahead.

Marguerite Porete and The Mirror of Simple Souls

Join us for the upcoming Spiritual Classics discussion on Marguerite Porete's classic writing, *The Mirror of Simple Souls*. We will meet on **Tuesday, May 7, at 7:30 pm in the Ascension Parish Center Dining Room**. Jeff Wood will lead the discussion. All Oak Park parishes are welcome.

The Mirror of Simple Souls is a dialogue among allegorical figures conversing about the nature of the spirit and the relation between the soul and God. Because human love is like divine love, Porete shows how the human soul can achieve a lasting union with God. Porete lived in a beguine community in the fourteenth century and the book became enormously popular throughout Europe at the time.

It is a beautiful place with much light and terrific furniture and household items, mostly donated. We plan to move another family into an apartment before the end of April. A single man with his sister and her family, four more people who were living in a van. Thank you all for your support for these families.

The housing part of this ministry has amazing volunteers who search for apartments, furniture and household items. And lots of volunteers who accompany these families once they are moved in. We could use more volunteers to accompany our families. Please consider this volunteer opportunity. It is so rewarding watching a new family settle in and become part of our community.

Our Tuesday and Thursday program is also expanding. The most recent count had more than 360 people coming for breakfast, clothing, blankets, toiletries. The English language classes are continuing.

Parish Pastoral Council Update

After discussion and reflection, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) of St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy and St. Giles affirmed its mission statement:

We, the Parish Pastoral Council recognize and rejoice that together we are a community with a diversity of gifts that collectively will bring an abundance of energy and talents to our unified Parish.

Guided by the Holy Spirit, our mission is to create an environment of trust where every voice is heard. We know that true unity is built upon love, forgiveness and understanding. We will listen to one another with compassion and respect to discern and address the pastoral needs of individual parishioners and the Parish Community.

At our most recent meeting on April 15, Marci Madary attended and presented an update on *Spirit and Light*, the collaborative effort of the Oak Park Catholic Community for living faith, including all the opportunities for religious education from pre-school through adulthood. Alex Ryan also met with the PPC to outline the evangelization component of our new reality. Food For Thought The Divine Force of Nature

"Remain In me as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me, you can do nothing." (John 15:4-5)

Saint Hildegard of Bingen was a
Benedictine abbess, mystic
and composer. She lived in the
12th century, and is one of
only four women Doctors of
the Church. (St. Catherine of Siena
is also one of the four Doctors).
Hildegard lived in the Rhineland
surrounded by the lush greenness
that would have influenced her thoughts
of the divine force in nature,
influencing the healing and wholeness
in God's power made manifest
in fruit bearing throughout creation.

This week we think about John's metaphor of the vine and branches, part of Jesus' "last discourse" (John 14-17).

Jesus desires to be the source of life and growth for those who remain in him. He invites the disciples, "Abide in me as I abide in you." His love sustains their lives and intimate relationships. Peter had said believing in the name of Jesus assumes his faith as their own. Believing in and through him lets us share his relationship with God and all creation. "Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them." (1 John 21). Our knowledge is from the Spirit he sent us.

All that is good to know, but Barnabas
In Acts of the Apostles puts energy
and flesh on it. When Saul became
a believer, many disciples
did not trust him. But Barnabas took charge
of Paul, vouching for him and accompanying
him on his missions. People who respond
to those in need are responding to grace
that we all need to develop
to a greater degree. Without a sustained
connection to God and what he cares about—
justice—we will dry up like withered leaves.
Being connected to God allows us
to bear fruit.

Hildegard reminds us that as humans we're called to co-create, to assist God, and to set into creative motion all that is necessary and life-sustaining.


