Fr. Carl's Corner



Happy Mother's Day to all moms! Today, we remember the mothers, grandmothers, and all women who mentor and care for others with a mother's heart and love. Many of us have lost our moms and today is a good day to call to mind a favorite memory that will bring a smile to our hearts and remind us of their love. Have a blessed day.

Last weekend and this weekend, many of our children received or will receive their First Holy Communion. Congratulations! Let us all remember the gift and importance of coming to Mass and sharing in the Eucharist. It's around the table that we are

reminded of God's unfailing love and support and experience the support of our community as we walk together in faith, hope and love.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives the Eleven a heavy task: Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature. Through our Baptism, he also commissions each one of us to this work. In our families, our schools, our workplaces, Jesus sends us forth to make his presence known. This is a profound challenge! We may feel as if we might be stumbling under our given loads, whatever those challenges may be. We may ask ourselves, how can I do this? Why is this so difficult? I consider all the challenges we face together with the parish unifications and the work of creating a new reality, new administrative structures that can work for the future with less ordained priests. I think about the work of our committees as they go through the process of the multi-site reviews, how many buildings do we have, how much do we need, and can we afford to care for all that we have? In the midst of dealing with these questions and realities, we are faced with the mission we are all called to do, proclaim the Gospel and invite others to come and know Christ.

Today's Feast of the Ascension not only invites us to participate in his work but reminds us that Our Lord carries any of our burdens with us. He does not take them away, but he lifts them as he walks with us. The Good News today reminds us of the power that raised Jesus from the dead and seated him at the right hand of the Father in Heaven. This same power has promised to be with us. Christ does not leave us in the Ascension but lifts our eyes and hearts inviting us to behold his power and glory. In the Eucharist that we come to share each week, he promises to be with us in our struggles and help us carry any of our burdens; he makes his presence known in a way we can taste and see.

Share this with someone you may know who has been away from the church or perhaps not back to Mass in person. We come together to renew our hope and be filled with confidence that God is with us on the journey.

I'll leave you with this to reflect on... What will I do this week to help put the Good News into action in my family or community?

MIGRANT MINISTRY UPDATE: The Ascension of the Lord

Thank you to donors and volunteers!

Because of your donations of money, clothing, food and much, more, Migrant Ministry is now supporting 11 families and two individual men in 9 separate, stable households. We estimate that we have helped with 9,000-10,000 visits from migrant men, women, and children at the Tuesday/Thursday mornings for food, clothing, toiletries, diapers, medical visits and ESL classes. We are helping with the immediate needs at Centro San Edmundo and long-term needs through the housing programs. All because of your donations. Thank you.

A special thank you to all those who walked or donated money at the **CROP Hunger Walk**. Migrant Ministry will be a recipient of a portion of the local funds raised. All global funds raised from the **CROP Hunger Walk** go to CWS (Church World Service) which provides services to the migrants as they travel north. Eighteen of the migrants were able to return the favor by walking to raise money for CWS here in Oak Park proudly waving their Venezuelan flag. Thank you all for the opportunity to support this organizations, too.

Our Tuesday/Thursday program is expanding. The most recent count is about 300-350 people coming each week for breakfast, clothing, blankets, toiletries. The English language classes are continuing and have now expanded to Saturday morning.

Food For Thought Evolution in Real Time

"With the creation of the study groups, ...it remains unclear what to expect when Synod delegates reconvene in Rome this fall, and what will be the agenda of the Second Assembly." (Christopher White)

Two years prior to the start of the Second Vatican Council, in 1960, Pope John XXIII appointed 10 commissions to lay the foundation for what became a hallmark event opening the Church's windows to the fresh air of global modernity.

One of the Council's major actions during that 1962-65 period was the establishment of the Synod of Bishops, to promote greater collegiality between bishops and the pope.

Under Francis, the Synod has evolved dramatically, including for the first time ever in 2023, the inclusion of lay people with the right to vote on the final document. In fact, theologians say the synod process is evolving in real time. Following last October's assembly of the Synod, the Pope decided to appoint working groups to study some of the hotter issues that emerged in the Synod so far.

Theologians agree many questions remain. Among the issues the study groups will address are how bishops are selected, seminary formation and the role of women in the Church, some of the most discussed and divisive topics that surfaced at the Synod last year. The Vatican said the group structures would help expand theological and biblical reflection—a step to deepen the conversation.

But it is a complex architecture.

Membership is meant to include theologists, Roman Curia and canon lawyers, making the outlook hard to assess. Membership has not been made public. In the 2023 Synod Assembly, there was intense debate over the role of women's ministry. It's unclear what to expect when delegates reconvene in October. There is strong support and activism in the push for women in the diaconate. The Pope has taken steps to assure its serious discussion.
