## Fr. Carl's Corner



Today's Gospel emphasizes the love that exists between the Father and the Son is the same love that must characterize the relationships of Jesus' followers. At a time when our Church and faith communities are facing changes that may frighten us or make us uneasy and anxious, I remind all of this critical message. This love is so foundational for Christians that we are commanded to love one another. St. John implores us to think about our next response. Give the gift of your full attention, it's about love. Those who do not know love, do not know God. We might ask ourselves who are we failing to love today? How might God's love be shown through us simply by extending a hand, greeting a stranger, being more kind or patient to a spouse or family member, sitting with someone who is ill or in mourning. When we come to Mass and share in the Eucharist, the spiritual food for our journey, we strive to follow Jesus' example to love one another, to love neighbor and God. We don't have to be perfect, but strive to be faithful and do our best.

One way we might show love and care for another these days is to practice good listening. Do we really listen? When in conversation with others or at meetings, do we avoid looking

and giving our full attention? Full disclosure here, I pray for the grace to work harder at this myself!!

So now for some good news for our faith communities! Many of you may have met Father Vittorio Brucella, a Claretian Priest living in their house here in Oak Park. Father Vittorio has helped at some of our Masses and has been instrumental in serving the spiritual needs of our migrants who we have been assisting. My hope was that the Order would keep Father Vittorio in the area so he might continue to assist us as well as two other neighboring parishes where he has been able to say Spanish Masses. Below is a communication he recently sent and asked me to share.

#### Peace to you!

It is with great joy that I have learned that I will be able to continue my ministry for the next three years alongside Father Carl Morello in the parishes of Oak Park.

As you know, I am Italian and a missionary priest belonging to the religious Congregation of the Claretian Missionaries.

In the Spirit of Easter, I write to you, the Catholic Christian community in Oak Park, offering and asking for Peace, the gift of the Risen Lord, as we continue our daily journey.

I am currently in Perth Amboy, New Jersey, but I will be heading back to Oak Park at the end of May. In the meantime, I share my Joy with each of you.

You are known for your human warmth with which, as a Community, you are welcoming many immigrants. Thank you for this testimony. In reality, it is precisely in this ability to recognize Jesus in the smallest, lonely and suffering ones that we will also be able to glimpse our future work.

Please send me your blessing from Oak Park so that the Lord may grant me the strength he alone grants to the humble to build the Kingdom.

The following is from Laura Kelley, Co-Coordinator for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd:


"Go out to all the world and tell the Good News!"

The Mirror of Simple Souls is a dialogue among allegorical figures conversing about the nature of the spirit and the relation between the soul and God. Because human love is like divine love, Porete shows how the human soul can achieve a lasting union with God. Porete lived in a beguine community in the fourteenth century and the book became enormously popular throughout Europe at the time.

#### MIGRANT MINISTRY UPDATE: TRINITY DONATION, SATURDAY ESL CLASSES, LEGAL ASSISTANCE!



The Migrant Ministry has so much to celebrate! The amazing young women of Trinity High School's Social Justice Club raised \$6,575 during a recent Spirit Week for the Migrant Ministry. The students created a variety of fun activities to raise the money and then proudly presented the check to Migrant Ministry leaders Margie Rudnik and Celine Woznica (who were so overwhelmed they actually got a little teary-eyed!). Thank you so much, Trinity Blazers!!! Saturday morning ESL classes have started to complement the Tuesday/Thursday classes that have been offered since last summer. The first Saturday, not one student showed up. Then we spread the word that parents can bring

their children if necessary. Twenty-three adults came ready to learn English while their children played in an adjacent room. The program will continue to grow as the word spreads. Yay! Our ESL program is run by volunteers with extensive ESL experience and education.

Our legal assistance program is getting organized with volunteers spending time at various workshops and other events to learn how to help migrants fill out their forms for Temporary Protective Status and for Asylum. Volunteer lawyers from our parishes are offering to review the completed forms.

Our numbers continue to grow for our breakfast and "free store" distribution of clothes, shoes, bedding, light jackets, and toiletries. That means we are in great need of donations! #### Food For Thought "The Greatest of These"

"Faith, hope and love abide, these three; But the greatest of these is love." (1 Corinthians 13:13) "The virtues of faith, hope and love emphasize a connection to other people, fueled by belief in God and reliance on prayer." (Pope Francis, 4/24/24)

Does our love respond to a command that's given in John 13 by Jesus? "This I command you: love one another." Basically, be kind to each other. 1 John Today speaks of loving God: "Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love." These loves differ: John's gospel on loving one another is Human Love. The love of God. as in 1 John. is Divine Love. Additionally, Love between family members is Familial Love. The more emotional kind of love. between two people, is Partner Love. In our language, we have one word, "love," for its various usages. Greek has four; one is "eros," from which comes "erotic." Enough on that!

The most powerful and selfless kind of love, I believe, is that which is embraced by clergy and religious. It can be called Ministerial Love. These priests and nuns have dedicated their lives to loving support and service in faith communities, and wherever people are in need or in danger. The shortage of priests is beyond severe, but motivated by faith and fueled by grace from the Holy Spirit, they fill the spiritual guidance and sacramental support needs of their Christian communities.

Nuns help migrants at the border, where the majority of people seeking asylum are from Latin America. The crisis there continues: 1.6 million have been arrested in total. Nuns in religious communities around the globe are doing plenty to help people trapped by war, oppression and tragedy of climate change. Starvation is a dark reality in many countries. Handmaids of the Holy Child Jesus in Nigeria; Little Sisters of Mary Immaculate in Kenya; Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in Uganda. All examples of religious' actionable love, motivated by devotion to the Blessed Mother, and by a depth of heartfelt compassion for those in dire need of loving guidance. and support. In their Ministerial Love, these nuns are living saints.


