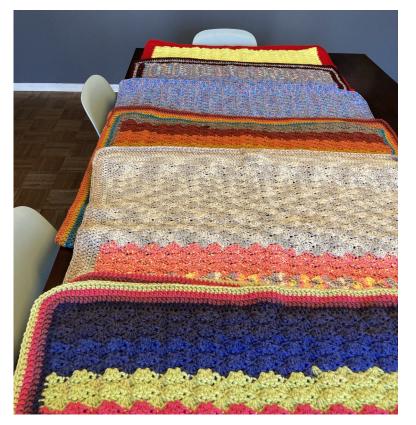
What More Can I Do?

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Statistics for the Quarter

Our crafters made 58 shawls, 80 blankets, many blessing squares and one scarf this quarter.

One of our newer crafters, Cindy Stone, made 62 lap blankets. See the picture.

People in need of our prayers received 73 shawls and 23 blankets. Recipients include people from Ascension and St Catherine/St Lucy, veterans, asylum seekers and even a woman in Mexico.

Blue Jean Saturday Asymmetrical Shawl

This one skein, easy wear shawl will look beautiful with your favorite blue jeans on a Saturday......but honestly, it will look great with anything on any day! This pattern was designed for my friend Dawn at "The Wooly Cabin" on Etsy, https://www.etsy.com/shop/TheWoolyCabin using her "Blue Jean Saturday Sock Yarn". I used all but 40" of the 463-yard skein. This is a very easy pattern to adjust in size, quit whenever you want in the pattern or make it bigger with more yarn.

Gauge: 5sts per inch in garter stitch

Blocked size: 77"x 17" at deepest point Fingering weight yarn – Model knit with The Wooly Cabin-Blue Jean Saturday Sock

Yarn

Size 6 (4.0mm) 24-32" circular needle

Key: Yo= yarn over; K2tog=knit 2 stitches together; Kfb=knit into the front then the back of same stitch; Tbl=through back loop; Wyib=with yarn in back

Cast on 5 stitches

Prep Rows

Row 1: (RS) k1, kfb, k2tog, k1tbl. (5sts)

Row 2: k3, kfb, p1. (6sts)

Row 3: k1, kfb, knit to last 3 stitches, k2tog, k1tbl.

Row 4: knit to last 2 stitches, kfb, p1.

Repeat rows 3 & 4 until you have 45sts on needle.

Lace Section – Note: the lace section is knit in stocking stitch (k right side, p wrong side). If you prefer to have the lace section in garter stitch, just knit the wrong side row and purl the last stitch.

Row 1 (RS): k1, kfb, (k2tog, yo, k2) rep to last 3 stitches, k2tog, k1tbl.

Row 2, 4, 6, 8: (WS) knit 1, purl to last 2 stitches, wyib kfb, p1.

Row 3: k1, kfb, k1, (k2tog, yo, k2) rep to last 3 stitches, k2tog, k1tbl.

Row 5: k1, kfb, k2, (k2tog, yo, k2) rep to last 3 stitches, k2tog, k1tbl

Row 7: k1, kfb, k3, (k2tog, yo, k2) rep to last 3 stitches, k2tog, k1tbl

Repeat Row 1-Row 8 two more times, (24 rows, 12 stitches added)

Garter Stitch Section

Row 1: k1, kfb, knit to last 3 stitches, k2tog, k1tbl.

Row 2: knit to last 2 stitches, kfb, p1.

Repeat these 2 rows 20 times, (40 rows, 20 stitches added)

You will continue the shawl by alternating the Lace and Garter Stitch Sections with stitch counts as follows.

Prep Garter Stitch Section: 45sts after completing

1st Lace Section: 57sts after completing

2nd Garter Stitch Section: 77sts after completing

2nd Lace Section: 89sts after completing

3rd Garter Stitch Section: 109sts after completing

3rd Lace Section: 121sts after completing

4th Garter Stitch Section: 141sts after completing

4th Lace Section: 153sts after completing (Notes: I had 20gms left before starting the

4th Lace Section, It took

15gms to finish this section)

Ending: Note: You will need 5gms to do the last 6 garter stitch rows and bind off.

Repeat Garter Stitch Section Rows 1 & 2, three times (6 rows)

Bind off



When you have finished a project, the leftover yarn can be used to make blessing squares.

Beachy Keen Shawl

Here's a pretty shawl for any time of the year. The Beachy Keen Shawl uses a relatively easy-to-remember shell stitch pattern to produce a nice triangle-shaped shawl. Because the pattern consists only of 2 rows, it's easy to make this shawl larger or smaller than the sample.

Materials: 2 skeins Red Heart Super Saver Ombre (each skein is 482 yds / 440 m). Sample color is Sea Coral.

Crochet Hook – Size H – 5 mm. If you crochet tightly, go up to a Size I or J hook.

Sewing needle (for weaving in ends). Scissors.

Size/Gauge: 60" across top span. 38" from neck to bottom point. Gauge: 2 shells x 3 rows = 6" sq.

Terminology: CH = Chain; DC = Double Crochet; TR = Treble Crochet; RPT = Repeat; SLST = Slip Stitch; ST = Stitch Instructions:

Notes: SHELL = 7 TR. When pattern states to DC in middle of SHELL, find the 4th TR from the SHELL row, and trace it upwards. A DC will be above it. Make your new DC in the top of that DC.

Similar concept for SHELL in the DC between SHELLs instructions.

BEGIN: CH 4. SLST to 1st CH.

ROW 1: CH 4 (counts as 1 TR). 6 TR in ring. Turn. (Total = 7 TR).

ROW 2: CH 3 (counts as 1 DC). 1 DC in next ST and in each

ST across. Turn. (Total =

7 DC).

ROW 3: CH 4. 6 TR in first ST. DC in middle of next

SHELL. SHELL in last ST.

ROW 4: CH 3. 1 DC in next ST and in each ST across.

ROW 5: CH 4. 6 TR in first ST. DC in middle of next

SHELL. SHELL in the DC between

SHELLs. DC in middle of next SHELL. SHELL in last DC.

ROW 6: CH 3. 1 DC in next ST and in each ST across.

ROW 7: CH 4. 6 TR in first ST. DC in middle of next

SHELL. *SHELL in the DC

between SHELLs. DC in middle of next SHELL* across.

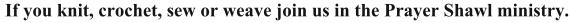
SHELL in last DC.

ROW 8: CH 3. 1 DC in next ST and in each ST across.

ROWs 9-40: RPT ROWs 7 & 8.

Feel free to RPT further to make a longer/wider shawl.

FINISH: Cut and weave in all ends. For (optional) fringe: Cut three 15" pieces of yarn. Fold in half and weave through edge of shawl. Trim evenly as needed.



Currently crafters are making shawls and lap blankets by knitting or crocheting but if you quilt or weave, you could also contribute blankets and shawls.
