Halt Keystone XL Construction Due to Coronavirus Public Health

Emergency: "TC Energy (formerly TransCanada) is disregarding public health and safety and moving hundreds of workers to rural and Tribal communities along the path of its proposed Keystone XL pipeline, endangering their well-being along with that of local community residents. These communities are unequipped to handle the public health threat of a COVID-19 outbreak, in addition to the increased crime and sexual violence – especially targeting Indigenous women -- arising from pipeline worker 'man camps.' ...**stand with rural and Tribal communities, calling on Montana Governor Steve Bullock to immediately halt all construction activity on the Keystone XL project and recall all workers TC Energy has *already* dispatched into the small rural and Tribal communities.**"

Prayer Vigil for Immigrant Justice

Welcome

First Intention (Read together)

We pray for the people being deported from all detention centers in the country, especially the ones deported from Jerome Combs Detention Center.

(You are invited to lift up names aloud of those who are being deported, those who have been deported, those who are in detention, or anyone affected by the inhumane immigration system.)

Faith Reflection - Jewish

Second Intention (Read together)

We pray for families who have experienced the devastation of raids and deportations. For the children who have lost parents; for the husbands and wives who were left alone to take care of their families; for all undocumented people who experience fear and live in a state of uncertainty.
