Meal Providers - Breakfast for the SHELTER at St. Catherine/St. Lucy, 38 N. Austin

Blvd: "We currently need 40 breakfast meals, daily. Each volunteer signup is responsible for 40 meals. If you are working in a group, please take this into account rather than the number of people you are working with.

We are providing breakfast to clients in our interim shelter location. Volunteers are needed to purchase food for breakfast meals. Food items a complete meal should be wrapped to be served individually. Food will be laid out for clients to select. Clients do have access to a microwave. **Drop off for breakfast should be before 9pm** on the **day you are scheduled for.** (Food will be given to clients the next morning)

The recommended breakfast items include:

- Pastry (i.e. muffin, bagel)
- Instant oatmeal or grits
- Yogurt
- Microwavable breakfast sandwiches
- Fruit cups
- Water bottles (Note: We are now encouraging volunteers to provide cases of water rather than soda or juice)

- 1. Site Captains recruit and manage a team of volunteers from your congregation to fill volunteer needs and/or meals for a night of shelter operation
- 2. Evening 6:30p until 10:30p (3 volunteers)
- 3. Overnight 10:30p until 5:00a (2 volunteers)
- 4. Morning 5:00a until 7:00a (2 volunteers)

This bipartisan bill will allow our new neighbors to <u>support themselves and their families</u> while bolstering the U.S. workforce. Can I count on your support?"
